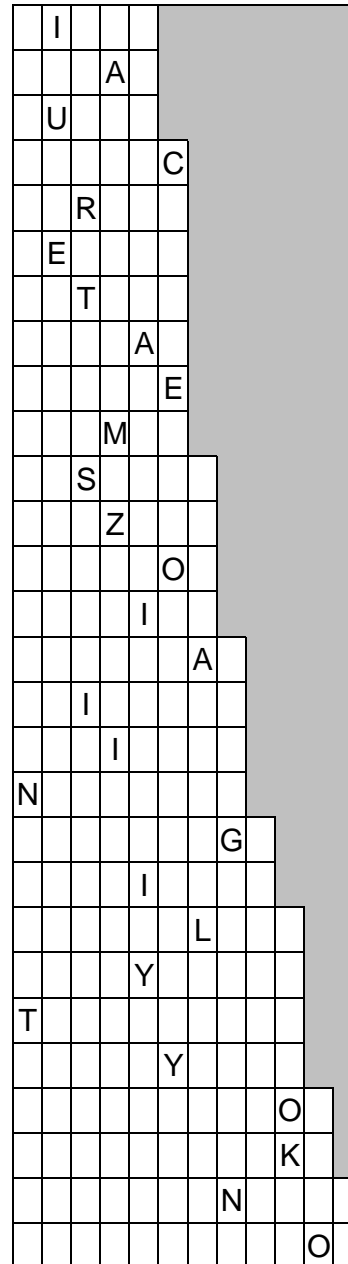


ALASKA!
